

Alaska Power Association Hank Nikkels Scholarship



Alaska Power Association (APA) is offering \$1,000 scholarship opportunities for Alaska residents attending college in Alaska who are studying electrical engineering or power generation.

APA is the statewide trade association for the electric utilities that supply power to more than a half-million Alaskans in communities from Barrow to Adak, through the Interior and Southcentral, and down the Inside Passage.



Hank Nikkels was a 25-year management employee of the Municipality of Anchorage at Municipal Light & Power and a leader in Alaska's electric industry who died in 2002. The Alaska Power Association membership established a scholarship in his memory to help ensure future electric utility leaders have an opportunity to further their education in the electric power industry.

Rules of eligibility

Who may apply: Alaska residents attending college in Alaska full-time or part-time working toward obtaining a doctoral, Master or Bachelor of Science degree in electrical engineering or an Associate of Applied Science degree in power generation/technology.

At the time of application, students must be at least a sophomore if pursuing a bachelor's degree or have completed two semesters if pursuing an associate's degree. Applicants must have a minimum 3.5 grade point average in college at the time of application. Preference will be given to students from communities that receive electric power from an Alaska Power Association member electric utility.

Scholarship process

A completed and signed application (located on the next page) must be accompanied by:

- A current official college academic transcript
- A letter of recommendation from each of the following individuals:
 - Instructor or department chair
 - Community, industry member, or employer
 - Personal reference
- A 500-word essay, including a personal history, that addresses these questions:
 - Why are you interested in pursuing a career in the electric industry?
 - In what role do you see yourself contributing to the electric industry in Alaska?

The completed application (see next page) and the supporting documentation (transcript, letters of recommendation, and essay) must be received by Alaska Power Association no later than 5 p.m. Friday, May 11, 2012. It is the responsibility of the scholarship applicant to contact Alaska Power Association to ensure that the scholarship packet was received by the deadline.

Important Notes

The Alaska Power Association Scholarship Committee will select the finalists based on the merits of the application and support documentation. Finalists may be interviewed.

The completed application and the supporting documentation (transcript, letters of recommendation and essay) must be received by Alaska Power Association no later than 5 p.m. Friday, May 11, 2012.

Scholarships should be submitted to Alaska Power Association in a sealed envelope that states, "APA Hank Nikkels Scholarship Application: Not to be opened until after the closing date."

In the event no qualified applications are received, the committee reserves the right to forego awarding a scholarship in a given year.

 - In what role do you see yourself contributing to the electric industry in Alaska?
- Sealed envelope that states, "APA Hank Nikkels Scholarship Application: Not to be opened until after the closing date."

The scholarship recipient will be publicly announced at the Alaska Power Association 61st Annual Meeting Awards Banquet on Thursday, August 9, 2012 in Juneau, Alaska. (After being selected, the scholarship recipients will be asked to supply a photograph that will be used in a presentation during the trade association's awards banquet.)

Scholarship recipients are required to provide the Alaska Power Association Board of Directors with a brief summary of academic achievements and a copy of an official transcript one year after receipt of the scholarship funds.
